Wider School Opening as of the 22nd June

We have appreciated your support as we work our way through the numerous challenges presented to us by the Covid-19 pandemic. Our on-going risk assessment, https://www.loddonprimary.co.uk/our-school/policies confirmed that it is safe to offer only a few more spaces to children on site before the summer holiday. We have also asked that pupils offered a space take up their space on Monday 22nd June to reduce constant change in groups as this disrupts teaching and potentially increases the risk of virus transmission into our school.

We recognise for those of you who replied 'yes' to the parent survey and then were unable to be offered a place, or who had hoped to send their child back in late June/July and cannot do so, this has been a week of disappointment and frustration. We also recognise for families who have taken the difficult decision they do















not want their child to attend school at all this summer their absence from school has become an increasing source of anxiety.

All of us agree on the importance of children being able to engage in education and we all wish for a time when Loddon pupils can collectively return to school. However; we must ensure that we achieve this safely and with due thought and care. For school this means working to the current guidance of Public Health England, the local authority and Department for Education in order to safeguard our children and staff.

Whilst school remains closed for many of you, we will continue to provide education via the school learning platform and interactive tools such as Bug club, education city and purple mash. This week we have also been calling all families in Y2-5, not able to return to site, offering further support for the learning resources provided by teaching staff and/or your child's well-being. I invite all families to continue to contact school if they need additional support, at any time during June and July, so that we can discuss this with you and either offer this ourselves or sign-post you to the appropriate service.

















Transition

During the next month we will be turning our attention to transition arrangements, these as you can imagine will also be different due to the pandemic, but we plan to offer our usual events of 'Meet the Teacher' and meetings for new parents either through remote systems or if we are able to on site in September. The local authority will currently not allow parent meetings on site due to infection controls but we hope this may change in the Autumn.

We also confirm that to support all our children's eventual return to school we have taken the decision to leave all class groupings as they are for the new academic year so your child can be reassured by knowing that they will return to the same class of children in the new academic year. Currently we are completing final interviews for new teaching staff and I will therefore confirm class teachers later in July when our recruitment process is finished.


Yourschooluniform.com - Ordering Logo embroidered school uniform

This week's book recommendations have been written by Year four children.






This is the story of a wonderful treehouse set in endless fields of grass. The book was written by Andy Griffiths and Terry
