Drop-off and Pick-up routines

Thank you to everyone for your support and co-operation in relation to our new routines for drop-off and pickup. We are very appreciative of you following the new systems on site to ensure the safety of children, parents, staff and visitors. A couple of reminders, to a small number of you, in order to make these systems as good as they possibly can be.

- Please arrive on site at the time for your year group drop off or pick up not before. There is no need to be on site before 8:35am in the morning or 3:15pm in the afternoon. If you are early please wait in your car or stand offsite until the appropriate time.
- Please follow the one-way systems shown by yellow arrows on the ground and signage around site.
- Try your hardest to social distance in queues and on playgrounds. There's lots of room so please spread out and use all the space available to you.
- Move along paths swiftly and leave school site as promptly as possible.
- Keep to one adult or older sibling per child or where possible per family for drop-off and pick-up. The
 principle is for the minimum number of people needed to come onto school site at any time. (Older
 secondary aged siblings accompanying you on the school run should also be asked to wait off site for
 you rather than having additional members of your family, over the age of 11, on site altogether.)

It has been brought to our attention by Wokingham Children's Service that there is an extremely upsetting and highly graphic video currently trending on TikTok of a man live-streaming his suicide. Whilst TikTok have stated that they are doing their best to remove the video, it has been shared across many social media platforms hundreds of thousands of times including under fake captions. Some captions on TikTok are as trivial as 'look at the pasta I cooked tonight' before the video then plays; therefore, children can come across the video without even searching for it.

This video is extremely distressing and we urge everyone to be vigilant and advise parents and carers to supervise very closely what children are accessing online.
