The last 2 weeks have been challenging for our community at Loddon not least for the self-isolating Year 1 children and their families; staff members either self-isolating or covering duties for absent colleagues and of course for those who have been unwell. I would therefore like to start this newsletter by thanking all the Y1 children for their commitment to remote learning at home; all the parents who have supported that remote learning; all the staff who have covered extra duties on top of their own and anyone who has given a word of encouragement or reassurance to our school - your words mean the world to us. These are indeed trying times for us all with forced changes to routines, disruption to our daily lives and the associated anxiety for children and adults alike. I am truly inspired by the ability of people to pull together and go the extra mile at such times and thank everyone who has done so for your contributions when our school needed you most.

Update on Coronavirus in School

As national Lock-down comes to an end Wokingham Borough has been placed in the Tier 2 High Alert. The school's risk assessment https://www.loddonprimary.co.uk/our-school/policies remains appropriate to this level and we will therefore continue our controls as before. To support our efforts please can we ask you to continue to follow rules, systems and signs on site. This currently includes wearing a face covering when dropping off at Reception and Nursery due to the narrow paths and reduced staff supervision in that area of our site.















The following paragraphs of this newsletter are in answer to a few questions we have received about how decisions are taken in school on who needs to self-isolate. Each situation will need to be judged on its particular circumstances but the guiding principle will always be to identify **contacts** in partnership with Public Health England's advice. These **contacts** would then all be required to self-isolate for 14 days (or 10 days from when they show symptoms). We are not required to prove all contacts beyond any doubt but rather to identify where there is a reasonable chance an individual could be a contact; for example, it would be reasonable to assume all Y1 children in a bubble are contacts with each other as they do not follow social distancing at this young age.

Whilst it will always be regrettable if we need to direct individuals to self-isolate it is absolutely a key tool in suppressing the virus and avoiding an outbreak on site. We will always follow DFE and Public Health England advice on who needs to self-isolate and will never underestimate the challenges associated with having to ask children or staff to do so - that said there will be occasions where the health and safety of all our school community means this simply has to happen.

The following definitions are useful in understanding this decision-making process further.

Contact definitions:

Direct close contacts: Face to face contact with a case for any length of time, within 1m, including being coughed on, a face to face conversation, unprotected physical contact (skin to skin). This includes exposure within 1 metre for 1 minute or longer.

Proximity contacts: Extended close contact (within 2m for more than 15 minutes) with a case.


Travelled in a small vehicle with a case.

Infectious Period:

The infectious period is from 48 hours prior to symptom onset to 10 days after, or 48hrs prior to test if asymptomatic.

Incubation Period: 1-14 days, usually 5 - 7 days.

When all members of the school community follow the risk assessment on site this should reduce the number of associated contacts that will need to potentially self-isolate and most importantly will help to suppress the virus.



*Under 12s and some other individuals are exempt from the use of face coverings. Face coverings are not a requirement in Primary schools however; we currently recommend them for drop off and collection to Nursery and Reception classes.















Second Hand School Uniform

Due to the current situation second-hand school uniform 'After-school' sales will be placed on hold until notice further. Any donations are most welcome but please ensure that items have been washed and placed in a carrier bag before dropping off into school in the box labelled 'second hand uniform donations' which has been provided and placed near the reception area.
