Reporting a pupil/staff positive Covid-19 test result during the half term

Please report this to <u>office-group@loddon.wokingham.sch.uk</u> at school as we are required to assist in identifying close contacts and advising self-isolation, if an individual may have been infectious whilst at school e.g. they showed symptoms within 48 hours of last being at school (by midnight on Saturday 29th May for pupils). The 'office-group' e-mail account will be checked every morning for notifications of a positive test result during the holiday period up to and including Friday 4th June. If you need to e-mail to report a positive test result please use the subject title 'positive test result' and include your child's or the staff member's name, year group, class, the date they tested positive, the date they first had symptoms and the date you have been told as a household to self-isolate until. Any subsequent required notifications to Loddon families in relation to contact with a positive case will then be sent out via Parentmail.

These activities have been centered around the "Human Senses": Touch, Sight, Smell and Hear. All the children have been learning how to use their senses to connect with the natural outdoor environment. They have learnt that calmness is essential if they want to see the robins, butterflies and creatures of the Forest. Throughout the Sessions the children have learnt to communicate their emotions and thoughts, with help from the Forest School Leader, by using clay and voice recordings. At first, expressing their emotions and thoughts was hard but all the children completed the activity. Extra groups of children have been helping Mrs Legg with the Site management and development and have helped plant newly donated planters, hung up bird feeders and insect houses, picked up litter from around the Site, cleared unwanted sticks and started to build a bug hotel.
