Having worries about a child is an uncomfortable feeling and you maybe unsure what to do. Whether you're concerned about your own child or another child, not knowing what to do or questioning if you've got things wrong can make it hard to act upon your worries. However; keeping children safe is everyone's responsibility and so it is always best to share worries and information to keep all children safe.

Attached to today's newsletter is an NSPCC booklet full of advice and information to help you recognise child abuse and neglect, and get help to children and parents that need it most.

## Water bottles

Please help your child to remember their water bottle when coming into school each day. It is helpful for a child's learning and wellbeing to remain hydrated throughout the school day. However; children should not be bringing carbonated or sweetened drinks in their water bottles. If your child needs a specific drink, due to a medical need, please speak directly to their class teacher so they are aware.
