Friday morning reading sessions return this summer term

In the summer term, as of Friday 29th April, we will be opening classroom doors at 8:30am each Friday and inviting parents to join their child in class to share a book together, look at your child's learning together from that week and if you need to also change their reading book together ready for the weekend. Prior to the pandemic and associated restrictions this was a popular weekly event for many parents/carers and we look forward to being able to return to these weekly Friday drop-ins once again.

When attending Friday morning reading sessions please respect the following guidelines.

- Arrive no earlier than 8:30am and leave the class by 8:40am (Nursery and reception) and 8:50am (Y1-6) so the school day can begin.
- Children may only attend early on a Friday if accompanied by a parent/carer and must be supervised by their parent/carer until the time when classroom doors would usually open 8:40am (Nursery and reception) and 8:45am (Y1-6).
- Please do not attend the session if you are unwell.










This week's book recommendations have been written by Year Two children.
