School Attendance

Attendance at school directly correlates to outcomes for pupils e.g. more time missed leads to reduced grades overtime and often can also impact children's friendship groups. In line with national policy we only authorise absence, in term time, due to exceptional circumstances. If requesting absence from school you will also be asked to provide evidence of that exceptional circumstance. Term time absence without an exceptional circumstance may be unauthorised and may lead to a fixed penalty notice being issued by Wokingham Local Authority.

Other child-friendly and convenient vaccination clinics will be open across Berkshire West over the next week. Appointments will become available on the National Booking Service or by calling 119, so please keep checking if you prefer to go to a clinic closer to home. Locations for these sites will be listed on the <u>Berkshire West Clinical Commissioning Group Website</u>.

Children aged 5-11 with no other underlying health conditions will be offered two paediatric (child) doses of the vaccine, with at least 12 weeks between doses.

As we move into Summer term we would like to remind you of the school uniform policy as follows. (Please pay particular attention to the detail of accepted footwear, tights and summer dresses/shorts.)

Please remember that long hair should be tied back at all times for hygiene and safety reasons with the use of a small, plain hair band/tie blue, black or white in colour.

Foundation Stage FS1

Own choice of clothing suitable for school activities.

Children may wear a Loddon sweatshirt or fleece or cardigan if they wish to

Foundation Stage FS2 and Year 1-6

Grey school trousers, shorts or skirt

White shirt, blouse or polo shirt

Blue Loddon sweatshirt or fleece or cardigan

Grey school pinafore dress

Blue and white checked dress

Black, white or grey socks (no other colours)

Black or grey tights

Black plain shoes or boots in winter (flat and closed toes for safety)

Black or white short, plain headscarf worn for religious reasons (thin material advisable)

Children also need suitable outdoor wear such as a coat in winter and a sun hat in summer.

PE Equipment (in a small drawstring bag - needed in school every day).

House T-Shirt

Lightweight trainers

Black shorts

Tracksuit (optional)

Long socks and shin pads

Black, grey or white short socks

Swimming Kit (in a waterproof bag).
